Winchester.

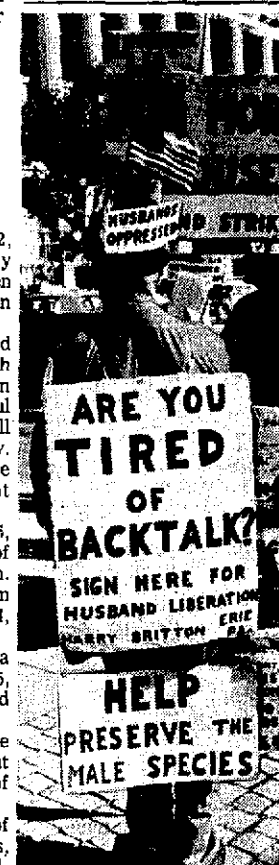
Funeral services will be held
