It is hereby certified That in conformity with the laws of the United States Lucretia C. Priss Widow of John Priss who was a Private Co. A. H. Regt Tennessee Volunteer Infantry is entitled to a pension under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890, at the rate of Eight dollars per month, to commence on the seventeenth day of September 1907 and to continue twelve dollars per month from April 1907 to 1908 during her widowhood unless she shall forfeit her right thereto. And she is also entitled to two dollars per month additional for each of the following named children while living and under the age of sixteen years.

That section forty seven hundred and forty-five, to hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4745.—Any pledge, mortgage, sale, assignment which has been, or may hereafter be, granted, shall be receive as a pledge, mortgage, sale, assignment or loan certificate, which has been, or may hereafter be given, for any debt, or promise, or upon any pretext of such conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding person who shall retain the certificate of a pensioner an missioner of Pensions, or a United States pension agent, or the pensioner, to receive the same shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.
